Aaron Richard Rosenthal age 82 passed away on February 16, 2022 on the birthdate of his oldest brother Avram Rosenthal who predeceased him. Aaron was raised in Detroit Michigan by his parents Philip and Esther Rosenthal. He received his bachelor and masters degree at the University of Michigan and then moved to California where he received his PhD at UCLA in Mathematics. After teaching at The University of Colorado and Whittier College in California Aaron went back to school to become an Actuary which was the profession he retired from working for Standard Insurance Company in Portland Oregon.

Aaron was very active and would get grumpy if he couldn't do something each and every day. He loved jogging, tennis, kayaking, sailboarding, biking and skiing. He also loved classical music having been raised in a family of musicians. The last instrument he played was the euphonium in the Wenatchee British Brass band. Aaron had a gentle soul with a twinkle in his eye for family and friends. He is survived by his older brother Arnold Rosenthal of Chevy Chase MD, his daughter Erica Rosenthal and his Grand Daughter Zoey of Issaquah WA, as well as Erica's Mother Judy Rosenthal of Scottsdale AZ, His nieces and
