



Beverly June Holmes

January 12, 1943 - December 4, 2012

Beverly June Holmes, 69, a longtime Manson resident, passed away on Tuesday morning, December 4, 2012 at her daughter's home in East Wenatchee, following an extended illness.

She was born on January 12, 1943 at Okanogan, Washington to the late Ervin and Marguerite Bernice (Terry) Holmes. As a young child, she moved with her family to Chelan. She was raised and received her elementary and high school education in Chelan, graduating with the class of 1961. She worked at various jobs in the Chelan area before moving to Spokane in the early 1970's. She started her own business in Spokane that was known as the "Forgotten Works", that was located in the Flower Mill Mall. She featured handcrafted items which included macramé works and candles. During the late 1980's, she followed her dream of clothing design and moved to Seattle, where she attended South Seattle Community College. In the early 1990's, she received her Associate degree in Apparel Design and returned to Chelan. During the mid 1990's, she went to work as a Purchasing Agent for the Colville Tribal Casinos at Mill Bay in Manson. She remained in that position until retiring in 2010. She continued to make her home in Manson.

Beverly was a lifetime member of the Chelan Eagles Lodge, Aerie # 2218. She loved sewing and making costumes. She was very talented and made costumes for the local theater group as well as Halloween and wedding dresses.

She is survived by two daughters and sons-in-law, Kyya & Don Grant, Othello,

WA and Chy & Jeff Mettler, East Wenatchee; two sisters and one brother-in-law, her twin sister, Bernice & Joel Bernatz and Betty Ruse all of Chelan; one brother and sister-in-law, Jack & Virginia Holmes, Chelan and two grandchildren, Colter Grant, Pullman/Othello and Laney Spry, East Wenatchee. She was preceded in death by her parents and one infant brother.
