October 21, 1939 - January 12, 2024

Bobbie Earl Camp, aged 84, passed on January 12, 2024. Born in Morrilton, Arkansas, on October 21, 1939, Bob enjoyed a life well-lived and well-loved.

A veteran of the U.S. Air Force, Bob's served from 1957 to 1961 as an aircraft mechanic. After his service, he continued to work as an aircraft mechanic and maintenance manager until he, along with his wife of 55 years, Winnie, moved their family to an orchard in Leavenworth, Washington, where they lived for 47 years. After retiring from farming, Bob took on the role of a school district bus mechanic and bus driver. Upon full retirement, he worked on perfecting his golf swing, rebuilding his beloved 1966 Ford Falcon, and being husband, dad, grandpa, and great grandpa to his adoring family, as well as a friend to all he met.

A jack-of-all-trades and master of "fix-it," Bob could tackle any task with just the right tool, duct tape, and determination, especially if it meant keeping orchard equipment, household plumbing and electrical, or the family fleet shipshape for his children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren. His love for his family was a force more powerful than gravity itself.

Bob charted his educational course through Yette Elementary and Orosi High schools, and earned his Airframe and Powerplant license at Reedley Jr College, Reedley, California. His love for learning was only rivaled by his

passion for golf, books, and the joy of family gatherings.

Bob's family includes his beloved wife, Winnie; his son and daughter-in-law, Michael & Lindsay Camp, and daughter Theresa Camp; his grandchildren, Alexis, Paige, Baxter, Gracie, and Ellie; and great-grandchildren Blayk and Winslow. Bob also leaves behind his sister, Alice, with her husband Harold Yates, as well as many nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by his parents, Opal and Robert Camp, his sister Bonnie Bickford-Camp, and brother Robert Camp.
