Bobby Calen Deason, 80, a Wenatchee resident for over 40 years, passed away

at his home on Friday morning, April 29, 2016, following an extended illness.

He was born on March 23, 1936 in Caddo, Oklahoma to the late Houston S.

Deason and mother Allie Rae (Hodge) Deason. He was raised and educated in

Caddo, Oklahoma. He journeyed his way to California and later worked his way up

to Seattle. He met Patricia "Pat" Wood-Boyles in Seattle and they were later

married on August 31, 1974 in Wenatchee. They made their first home in Seattle

prior to moving to Wenatchee in the summer of 1975. Bob worked as a Bartender

at Peppy's Tavern in Wenatchee for several years before starting his own

landscaping company known to many as "The Gardener". Following his retirement, they continued to make their home in Wenatchee. On February 17, 2011, he was preceded in death by his loving wife, Patricia "Pat" Deason.

Bob loved his children, grandchildren and great grandchildren. He immensely enjoyed his western shows in particular Gunsmoke and Bonanza. His favorite movie of all time is "Chisholm (Trail)". He liked his western wear complete with cowboy boots, hat and his Old Spice aftershave. He was a man known for his simplicity and unique sense of humor.
