Cale Baker Carter, 78, was born in Portland, OR on March 16, 1931. At a young age, his family moved to Northern California and then to Chico, CA. He spent most of his school years in Chico and graduated from Chico State University with a degree in Engineering. After graduation, he was employed by the government at Puget Sound Naval Shipyard in Bremerton, WA as a Civil Service Naval Architect. Cale met Virginia, (his second wife), whom he married in 1965, creating a combined family of eight. In 1966, the family moved to Japan for five years, when he accepted a job with the Military Sealift Command in Japan, controlling the repair and movement of the MSC ships during the Vietnam War. Cale and his family thoroughly enjoyed Japan, traveling extensively, taking advantage of the opportunity to explore the culture and people. The family returned to the United States, living in Northern Virginia, California and then back to Virginia, until his retirement to East Wenatchee, WA. Cale volunteered at the Wenatchee Museum, where he was part of a group that restored the pipe organ.

He leaves behind his wife, Virginia; daughter, Cathy and husband, Mike Mosman; son, Bob Carter; son, Mark Carter; daughter, Glennis Dolce; daughter, Louise Carter and husband, John McCleskey; and daughter, Carol and husband, Charley Zeni; 11 grandchildren; and two great-granddaughters.
