Camille Jones Wade, 83, passed away on Sunday, December 4, 2011, from injuries sustained in a fall.

She was born on January 21, 1928 in Colfax, Washington, the daughter of Irwin and Elma (Wiggen) Jones. She was raised in Wenatchee and attended Wenatchee High School where she graduated with the class of 1944. She attended Stephens College in Columbus, Missouri and Washington State College. While at WSC, she joined Kappa Kappa Gamma sorority where she formed lifelong friendships with her sorority sisters. She received her Bachelor's Degree in English in 1948. She then returned to Wenatchee and worked as a teller at Wenatchee Federal Savings and Loan.

On September 10, 1949, she married Jim Wade. Her life was spent raising her family and maintaining the family home with summers at Lake Chelan. She had a passion for travel and together with Jim explored the world, visiting every continent except Antarctica. Her family and grandchildren are fortunate to have traveled with her and she passed her enthusiasm for travel on to them.

Camille was a member of Wenatchee First Presbyterian Church, the Zetetic Book Club, and numerous bridge clubs in the area. She enjoyed reading, snow and water skiing, swimming, playing bridge and her grandchildren. She is survived by her husband, Jim, two sons and daughters-in-law, Mark Wade & Karen Lidikay and Mike & Karen Wade; one daughter and son-in-law, Susan & Gus Heinicke, and seven grandchildren, Sara and James Wade;
