



Charles Edgar Munson

June 3, 1925 - June 24, 2015

Charles "Chuck" Munson of Wenatchee passed away June 24th, 2015. He was born to Ivan and Pearl Munson on June 3, 1925 in Tonasket, Washington. He graduated high school in Wenatchee and then enlisted in the Army. He served in the 25th Infantry Division in World War II. After being discharged, Chuck attended Washington State College, where he earned his BA in Civil Engineering. He met his wife, Carroll Allen, while attending and they were married at Pullman in 1950. After graduating, they moved to Salem, Oregon where he worked for the Oregon State Highway Department. After 12 years, they moved their family to Wenatchee, where Chuck started his own engineering company, Munson-Nash-Commack. The name was later changed to Munson Engineers.

Chuck really enjoyed his time as a Reserve Officer with the Wenatchee Police Department, which he joined in 1970 serving for over 20 years. He enjoyed his years of singing with the Wenatchee Apollo Club. Charles also enjoyed watching videos and reading. In June of 2000, Carroll and Charles celebrated their 50th Wedding Anniversary, truly a special occasion for everyone; in 2007 Carroll passed away. There wasn't a day that went by that he didn't miss her. They always said they were "soul mates".

Surviving are his children, Mike and Meri Munson, Renton; Vicki and John Pfeifer, Lynnwood, and Nancy and John Hatzenbihler, East Wenatchee; six grandchildren and twelve great-grandchildren.

Charles was preceded in death by his wife Carroll, his parents, and his sister

Val Ogden.
