



David Curtis Keniston

July 6, 1944 - June 1, 2012

David C. "Dave" Keniston, 67, a 30 year Central Washington resident and an 8 year Wenatchee resident, passed away on Friday morning, June 1, 2012 at Central Washington Hospital, following a brief illness.

He was born on July 6, 1944 at Dickenson, North Dakota to Charles "Bud" and Amy Rose (Grogan) Keniston. He was raised and attended schools in Missoula, Montana. Following high school, he went to work at a saw mill in Missoula, prior to going to work in the construction industry. He worked in general construction until finding himself in cement finishing. He had worked on the construction projects of many of the northwest dams, before becoming disabled.

He moved to Pateros in 1982 and remained there until moving to Wenatchee in 2004.

Dave enjoyed going steelhead fishing and panning for gold up on Hart's Pass.
