Diana May Mix Patterson, age 78, passed away peacefully at home surrounded by her family on Tuesday, December 27, 2022, after a short yet courageous battle with cancer.

Born February 23, 1944, in Rupert, ID to Alvin "Bud" Franklin and Belva May Mix. Diana was raised on the Mix Farm in Heyburn Idaho and graduated from Minico High School in 1962. After graduation, she left Heyburn for 12 years until she was reunited and married her high school sweetheart Robert C. Patterson on October 12, 1974.

For 21 years Diana ran an in-home daycare, Country Bumpkins, in East Wenatchee. One of the fondest memories for Diana was while on vacation she delivered her niece's baby in the back of the car. She had a love for red roses, butterflies, and her fur babies. She enjoyed collecting dolls, perfumes, and swan figurines. After retirement, Diana enjoyed her spare time with her family.

Diana was a member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints, where she held various callings. She had the honor of serving a Temple calling at the Columbia River Washington Temple from June 2012 through June 2014. She was a people servant and continued caring for others up until her death.

Diana is survived by her husband, Robert C. Patterson in East Wenatchee, WA; children: Todd (Holly) Patterson of Brigham City, Utah, Robert B. (Nataly) Patterson of Racine, Missouri, Jeanette (Tim) Goldie of Echo, Oregon, Corey (Lisa) Patterson of Grapeview, WA, and numerous grandchildren, great-grandchildren and many nieces and nephews. She is preceded in death by her parents, sister, Marilyn Rodabaugh, and daughter, Alisa Hale.

Funeral services will be conducted at 11:00 am on Saturday, January 7th at the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints Maiden Lane Chapel located at 1621 Maiden Lane, Wenatchee, WA with viewing being held 1 hour prior. The interment will be at Evergreen Memorial in East Wenatchee, WA. In lieu of flowers, the family has asked donations to be made to the American Cancer Society.
