Donald Eldon "Don" Reiman, 81, died on June 5, 2016 in Wenatchee, WA. He was born on September 21, 1934 to the late Fred and Lena (Weber) Reiman in Dryden. Don grew up and attended school in Dryden, graduating with the Class of 1953. After graduation, he entered into the US Army. During his senior year of high school, he met Claudette Parrish from Wenatchee; they married on November 23, 1956. Don found employment with Boeing and the couple made their first home together in Seattle; during his years with Boeing, "Home" was in the Puget Sound. Don and Claudette welcomed four children to the family, Jim, Ron, Teri and Debbie. In 1973, the family relocated to Wenatchee to help with ageing parents. The family all worked in the apple harvest until Tree Top, in Cashmere, hired Don as a Pressman; he retired after 30 years of employment.

During the children's young years, Don coached Pee Wee Baseball and helped with Cub Scouts outings. He enjoyed participating and traveling around the Everett area to model airplane flying competitions. In the late 70's he raced B Stock cars at the Wenatchee Valley Super Oval. The totaling of #7 ended his race! Don's love of fishing was shared with his family during camping trips at this favorite fishing holes, Fish Lake, Porters, and Jameson. As an avid sports fan, Don loved watching and talking about the Mariners and Seahawks with Len and Fish.

He is preceded in death by his parents; sister, Dorothy Kristek; brother, Howard Reiman; son, Jim Reiman and wife, Claudette.

Don is survived by his family, whom will forever remember him as quiet, stubborn and having a dry sense of humor, and lovingly referred to as Eeyore; children, Ron Reiman, Malaga, Teri Reiman, Wenatchee, Debbie Fincher, Brewster; daughter in-law, Brenda (Len) Little, East Wenatchee; sister, Arlene Tibbits, Poulsbo; 12 grandchildren and 10 great grandchildren.
