A Wenatchee area resident for 35 years, passed away at his home in Wenatchee on Tuesday, October 11, 2011, following an extended illness. He was born on September 21, 1939 in Pateros, Washington to the late gust Adolph & Esther Katheryn (Krause) Peterson.
