Edith Feld, 95, a Wenatchee Valley resident and former longtime Detroit, Michigan resident, passed away on Friday, December 15, 2017, at Blossom Creek Memory Care in Wenatchee, Washington.

She was born on November 10, 1922 in Detroit, Michigan, the oldest of seven children born to Solomon and Jenny (Levine) Rash. She was raised and received her education in Detroit. She graduated from the Detroit Northern High School in 1940. She was married to Leo Feld in June of 1947. They made their home together in Detroit. Edith worked at Fort Wayne in Detroit during World War II. Later, she worked for Detroit Public Schools as a School Bus Aide where she worked and rode with special needs children. She retired in 1996 at the age of 74. She remained in Detroit until moving to Mount Vernon, Washington in 2002. She moved to the Wenatchee Valley in 2015.

Edith especially enjoyed being around family and playing card games such as poker with her girlfriends and gin rummy and canasta with her family.

She is survived by two sons and one daughter-in-law, Ron Feld & Lorna Klemanski (Wenatchee) and Paul Feld (Pulaski, Wisconsin); her sister and brother-in-law, Brooke & Myron Fine (Dallas, Texas) and numerous nieces and nephews. She was preceded in death by her parents, her husband of 25 years, Leo Feld in January of 1973, one brother, Morris Rash and four sisters,
