



## Frederick William Yopp

October 3, 1942 - May 10, 2015

Fred W. Yopp, 72, East Wenatchee, a 47 year Wenatchee and East Wenatchee resident, passed away at his home on Sunday may 10, 2015, following a brief illness.

He was born on October 3, 1942 at Chelan the son of the late Sherman and Alma (Smith) Yopp. He was raised and received his schooling in Chelan and graduated from the Chelan High School. Following high school, he entered the U.S. Army and served until receiving his honorable discharge and returning to Chelan. He went to work for the railroad until going to work at Alcoa in 1968.
