



Glen Charles Hagstrom

August 27, 1942 - January 14, 2017

Glen Hagstrom, 74, a longtime Wenatchee resident, passed away at his home on Saturday, January 14, 2017, following an extended illness.

He was born on August 27, 1942 at Spokane, Washington to the late Charles Andrew and Violet Mae (Sloan) Hagstrom. He was raised in the Cheney-Medical Lake area and graduated from the Medical Lake High School with the class of 1960. Following high school, he moved to Seattle where he worked for a punch card computer company known as "Tab Check". He was married to his dancing partner, Dorothy Ann Ritter on June 3, 1962 in Seattle. They moved to Wenatchee briefly before moving to the Pasadena, California area. In the late 1960's, they returned to Wenatchee where Glen worked for Dick Woods at Wood's Printing. During the mid 1970's, they moved to Ephrata and Glen became the Publisher of the Grant County Journal newspaper. He accepted a job in the commercial side of a company known as "Scripts League Newspapers", a company that owned several newspapers and they moved their family to Hamilton, Montana. In 1978, they moved to Taft, California where he worked with two of their newspapers conjointly. They returned to Wenatchee in 1986 and he went to work at Commercial Printing for the next 19 years. He also assisted part time in the printing department at The Wenatchee World.

Glen loved hunting and fishing and playing golf. When his health prevented him from playing golf, he enjoyed playing golf on the computer. He was a woodworker and cabinetmaker. He also enjoyed playing cards with his family

for money (change mostly).

He is survived by his wife of 54 years, Dorothy A. Hagstrom, Wenatchee; two sons and daughters-in-law, Charles "Chuck" & Mary Hagstrom, Taft, CA and Shawn & Kim Hagstrom, Chico, CA; brother, Richard "Dick" Hagstrom, Kent, WA; eight grandchildren; 10 great grandchildren and three brother in-laws whom he thought of as brothers, Frank, Stan and Robert Ritter.

He was preceded in death by his parents, three sisters, Betty McGauhey, Shirley Babst, and Audrey Krum and brother, Larry Hagstrom.
