



Hazel Marvel Wallace

December 16, 1931 - November 16, 2017

Hazel M. Wallace 85, of Rock Island, a 35 year Wenatchee Valley resident, passed away on Thursday, November 16, 2017 at home.

She was born on December 16, 1931 at Trail, British Columbia, Canada to the late Joseph and Margret (Hodgson) Flynn. She was raised and educated in Trail, B.C. where she met and later married Donald B. Wallace on October 26, 1951. They made moves throughout the Kootenay Loop areas that included Nelson, Castlegar, New Denver, Silverton and Trail. She was a homemaker and raised her daughters before entering the workforce. She worked at the Hospital in Trail B.C. as a Nurses Aid in the ICU and Pediatrics units. She had worked at her parents Taxi Cab Service as a Cab Driver and as a Bookkeeper at Miller and Brown Trucking Company. In 1964, they immigrated to the United States making their first home at Boundary Dam near Metaline Falls, Washington. In 1968, They moved their family to Wilbur where Hazel became a Secretary for the School District. She later became a licensed Barber, Beautician and Cosmetologist and owned and operated the business known as "Hazel's Barber and Style" in Wilbur. In 1982, they moved to Malaga and in 1994, they moved to Rock Island. She was preceded in death by her husband, Donald B. Wallace on June 4, 2002. She has since continued to make her home in Rock Island.

Hazel raised chickens while in Wilbur and had two pet Parrots, "Pickles" and "Pepper". She enjoyed travelling, gardening, sewing, oil painting and collecting ornamental chickens.

She is survived by two daughters, Melinda Sinclair, Rock Island, and Shelley Wallace, Wilbur; one brother, Bryan Flynn, Castlegar, B.C.; two sisters and brothers-in-law, Phoebe & Ron Laybourne, Nelson, B.C. and Colleen & Doug Bailey, Grand Forks, B.C.; two grandchildren, Johnathon "John" (Lauri) Bonniwell and Benjamin Joseph "Joe" (Angela) Bonniwell all of East Wenatchee and six great-grandchildren, Sheldon Birks, Taylor, Madeline, Ava, Ben and Ryan Bonniwell all of East Wenatchee. She was preceded in death by her parents and her husband, Donald.
