Isabel Perez Sr., 83, a 3 year Malaga resident and former longtime Linda, California resident, passed away at home on Friday night, February 8, 2013, following an extended illness.

He was born on November 20, 1929 at Taft, Texas to the late Bonifacio and Juanita (Ortiz) Perez. His family made a number of moves in Texas while he was growing up. He entered the workforce and worked the agricultural jobs in Texas with his father. He was married to Felicitas Granidos in San Antonio, Texas.
