After the passing of his father, his mother remarried and moved to Wenatchee to run the local Dairy Queen. At her request, Jack and his young family; Joyce (first wife), David and Sharon moved out West in 1954.

Soon after, Jack became general manager of the Faskin-Grieme theatre chain, which included the Liberty Show Palace and 6 other indoor and outdoor theatres for 20 plus years.

Sales were always in his blood, heart and head. Following the sale of the theatre chain in 1977, Jack worked for SavMart as a top salesperson for another 20 plus years and ended his sales career with Allen Furniture of East Wenatchee.

He was a proud member of the Elks and the Eagles lodge serving our community in a variety of ways for 60 plus years. Jack was also a charter
