Jim Duane Haney, age 69, peacefully passed away on Monday, August 7th, 2023, surrounded by his loving family after a valiant battle with cancer. His mother, Rosa Haney, and his sister, Janet Purinton, along with brothers Rick Haney and Steve (Steffanie) Haney, and numerous nieces and nephews, also mourn his passing. A long-time friend, Steve Riley, shared a cherished bond with Jim. Jim was preceded in death by his father, Othel Haney, in 2014, and a brother, James David Haney, in 1952.
