



Kathleen Hope Moser

May 11, 1944 - July 22, 2017

Kathleen (Kathy) Moser left this world to be with her Lord on Saturday July 22, 2017. Her passing came after a brief battle with cancer. Kathy died surrounded by her loving family. She is survived by her husband of 31 years Wayne Moser of Wenatchee, her three children: Jeff Hawk (Kristi) of East Wenatchee; Steve Hawk (Traci) of Ferndale; Shirley Gloyn (Stuart) of Coulee City; and two step children: Ron Moser of Moses Lake and Donna Taylor of Moses Lake; ten grandchildren and two great-grandchildren. Kathy is also survived by her brother, Don Gills (Donna) of Spokane and sister, Billie Hammond (Hank) of East Wenatchee, and seven nieces and nephews that she loved dearly. She was preceded in death by her mother Edith, and sister, Carol Anne.

Kathy was born Kathleen Hope Gills on May 11, 1944 in Wenatchee Washington the fourth child of Edith and Carson Gills. She graduated from Eastmont High School in 1962. Kathy was a talented artist, always painting, drawing, or crafting something in her workroom upstairs. She also loved to garden, read and work jigsaw puzzles. One of her favorite activities that she missed so much after she got sick was riding her bicycle, even at 73 she was living life to the fullest. Before retiring, Kathy worked many years in the fruit packing industry, starting at Wenatchee Wenoka, then Chief Wenatchee, and finally Stemilt Growers. As a single mother, Kathy worked hard to provide for her family and taught her children the value of hard work.

In May of 1986, Kathy married Wayne Moser and they made their home in Wenatchee. Together they enjoyed watching their grandchildren play sports as well as cheering on Kathy's beloved Seahawks and Mariners.

Kathy chose to give in death, as she did in life, and was registered as an organ donor. She was a cornea donor, generously making sight available to the blind.

A celebration of life and memorial service will be held on Saturday, August 19 at noon at the Living Room Church 230 N. Georgia, East Wenatchee, Pastor Allan Fox presiding.
