



Kerrie Lynn Boettiger (Harmon)

July 21, 1962 - November 27, 2011

Kerrie Lynn (Harmon) Boettiger, 49, a 35 year combined Wenatchee Valley resident, passed away on Sunday, November 27, 2011 at Central Washington Hospital.

She was born on July 21, 1962 in Wenatchee to Jim and Barbara Harmon. She was raised and began her schooling in Wenatchee and moved with her family to East Wenatchee as an early teen. She continued her education and Graduated from Eastmont High School in 1980. She worked at a number of different jobs that included Safeway in the Seafood Department, David Rodstals until moving into the wireless business. In 1992, she met Steve Boettiger and together they ran Mobile Connections in Wenatchee. In 1996, she moved to Kingman, Arizona, where she managed the Cellular One Store. In 1999, she moved to Great Falls, Montana, where she worked selling cellular services until returning to work in Kingman, Arizona.

On March 30, 2005, she was married to Steven Joseph Boettiger where they made their home together in Kingman, Arizona until moving to East Wenatchee over two years ago.

She was a member of King's Orchard Church of Christ in Wenatchee.
