Lana Jo Salvino, 70, a 10 year East Wenatchee resident and former longtime Lynnwood resident, passed away on Friday morning, August 14, 2015 at Highgate Senior Living in Wenatchee.

Lana was born on December 20, 1944 in Tacoma, Washington to the late Aldo and Leta "Louise" (Thulean) Faletto. She was raised and attended school in Chelan and graduated with Honors with the class of 1963. She also was active on the high school Drill Team and received special honors in Home Economics.

Lana continued her education at Central Washington College in Ellensburg, where she received her Bachelor's degree in Education in 1967. She accepted a teaching job with the Edmonds School District and taught first grade at the Cedar Valley Elementary school, Edmonds Elementary School and the Spruce Primary School in Lynnwood. In 2005; she retired after teaching for 38 years and moved to East Wenatchee to be near her family.

Lana was active in the churches she attended, starting with her childhood Christian Church in Chelan, later the Northlake Christian Church in Lynnwood and finally at Trinity United Methodist church in East Wenatchee. She was voted "Woman of the Year" by her church family at Trinity United Methodist Church.

Lana enjoyed her grandchildren, sewing, reading, gardening, watching NCIS every Tuesday night on Television, reading the Sunday paper in bed, eating hamburgers and Chinese food. Lana loved shopping sales and was an early

bird at Black Friday sales every year.

She is survived by one son and daughter-in-law, Jason and Becky Krawczyk and two grandchildren, Chloe and Tommy Krawczyk, all of East Wenatchee; two sisters, Eleanor Clark, East Wenatchee and Glenna Fisher, Chelan; and her two longtime dear friends, Kathy and Dottie. She was preceded in death by her parents and an infant brother, John Carl Faletto.
