Marian A. Weythman, 86. A 65 year Monitor resident, passed away on Monday, January 19, 2015, at Colonial Vista Convalescent Center, following a brief illness.

She was born on December 24, 1928 to the late George and Thelma (Wheeler) Rumohr at Omak, Washington. At an early age, she moved to the Wenatchee Valley and attended Wenatchee schools. She graduated from Wenatchee High School with the class of 1947. She met Donald L. "Don" Weythman and they were later united in marriage on April 9, 1949 in Wenatchee. They made their home together on the family farm and orchards at Monitor.

Marian went to work in Wenatchee as a teller first at N.B.C. Bank and later at Sea First Bank. In 1962, she became the Receptionist at Cashmere Medical Center and remained working there for 31 years before retiring in 1993.

Following her retirement, she and Don became travelers and were not only Arizona Snow Birds but additionally travelled to Australia, Mexico and throughout Europe.

On December 11, 2002, she was preceded in death by her husband, Donald "Don" Weythman. Marian has since continued to make her home in Monitor.

Marian was a longtime member of the Monitor United Methodist Church.

She enjoyed playing Bridge with her couples group, her flower gardens, camping with the girls and their annual fishing trips to Westport with the Monitor Crew.

She is survived by one daughter and son-in-law, Pamela "Pam" & Larry James, Cashmere; one son, Melvin "Mel" Weythman, Monitor; one sister, Peggy Henkel, Easton, WA; two half sisters, Norma Jean Meyers, Huntsville, AR and Georgeana Thornton, San Antonio, TX; three grandchildren, Brian James, Cashmere, Shannon Stoffel and Jason James both of Cashmere and three great grandchildren, Mikayla, Brayden and Madisyn Stoffel all of Monitor. She was preceded in death by her parents, her husband, Donald and one sister, Betty Goodall.
