



## Martha Fay Smith

Martha Fay Smith, 68, of Wenatchee, a former longtime Brewster and Bridgeport resident, passed away on Monday, May 23, 2011 at RiverWest Retirement Community in Wenatchee.

She was born on July 30, 1942 at Comfort, Texas, to the late Leon and Martha (Noah) Peters. As an early teen, she moved to Brewster, where she attended junior high and high school, graduating with the class of 1960. Following high school, she was married to Dan Galbraith in Brewster, where they continued to make their home together.
