Norman Maydole, 82, passed away on March 3, 2023.

He was born on May 21, 1940, in Everett, WA, to Gilbert and Betsy Maydole. He graduated from Everett High School in 1958. On October 12, 1963, he married Carolyne Schooler in Wenatchee, WA.

After the birth of their only child Russell (Nov. 1964), Norman and Carol moved to Everett, WA, and then Lake Stevens, WA, where they lived for 34 years.

Norm worked for Scott Paper Company directly out of high school, then shortly after was hired on with the National Forest Service as a fire suppression and lookout crew member. Norm also worked as a machine operator before he decided to join the local electrical union where he attended a four-year apprenticeship and became a Journeyman, and later, Master Electrician. He worked for several contractors before opening his own successful business in 1970, Western Electric and Heating. Norm retired in 2000.

Norm was baptized in 1958 as one of Jehovah's Witnesses and attended the Cashmere congregation since 2000.
