She would mow her lawn in two directions to assure every blade was trimmed. Every morning Ola would rise at quarter to five, no exceptions. And until the last month of her life, she rode her stationary bike every day.

She had an incredibly special bond with her twin sister Opal. They were inseparable. As adults, they talked multiple times daily on the phone. As young girls, they loved telling about occasionally switching their dates when

boyfriends came to pick them up with no one knowing except them. When Opal passed part of Ola's heart went with her.

After Chet retired from carpentry, he became a reflexologist and Ola assisted him in this business visiting with each patient as they waited their turn.
