October 11, 1934 - November 28, 2012

Richard Jack Jonas, 78, longtime Santa Ana, CA resident passed away in Wenatchee, WA on November 28th, 2012 at his daughters home with his loving family by his side. following an extended illness and a fight with cancer.

He was born on October 11, 1934 in Richardton, North Dakota to the late Jerome J. and Anna F. (DeWald) Jonas. He was raised on their family farm near Richardton until the age of 15. His family sold the farm and they moved to Yakima, WA. He continued farming and agriculture by picking cherries, peaches, apples and hops.

He entered the U.S. Navy in 1954 and served during the Korean War. While home on leave, he was married to Patricia Dube in Yakima. Upon receiving his honorable discharge, he returned to Yakima where he worked with his father-in-law as a Commercial Building Painter. He was a father to five children; Carol "Kara", Michael, Theresa, Daniel and John.

In the early 60's Richard divorced and moved to Santa Ana, California where he worked for Milo John Deere Company as a heavy equipment mechanic. In 1968 he married Cora Marie Neeley.

After working at John Deere for several years, Richard branched out and started his own business known as "Richard's Tractor Service" in Santa Ana,

CA. He was in business for 25 years and retired in 2003.

He was a longtime member of the Santa Ana Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) Post #10694. He loved telling jokes, teasing people and making them laugh. He also enjoyed fishing and fixing all kinds of things.

Richard had recently moved back to Washington to be closer to his children. Richard is preceded in death by his son Michael W. Jonas and his brother Edward A. Jonas.

Richard is survived by his wife of 43 years Cora M. Jonas, brothers; Christopher Jonas, Willie Jonas, Jerry Jonas, and sister Clementine Jonas-Murphy, his children Kara Shephard, Theresa Jonas, Daniel Jonas and John Dube. He also has a large extended family including many grandchildren and great-grandchildren.

A graveside internment service will be held on April 29, 2013 at Calvary Cemetery, Yakima, WA at 11:00am. Arrangements are in the care of Heritage Memorial Chapel, East Wenatchee, WA.
