



## Robert Allen Brandenburg

August 29, 1937 - January 16, 2010

Entiat and long-time Washington resident Robert Brandenburg died January 16, 2010 in Wenatchee, Washington after a courageous battle with pancreatic cancer.

A celebration of life will be held at 10 A.M. on February 1st in East Wenatchee Washington, at the Heritage Memorial Chapel, 19 Rock Island Rd., followed by a graveside service in Twisp Washington at 2pm in the Beaver Creek Cemetery.

Robert (Bob) was born in Guthrie, Oklahoma in 1937 and shortly thereafter moved with his family to Glasgow, Montana. He graduated from Glasgow High in 1957 and lived there with his family until 1962, when he moved to Washington.

Bob had an infectious laugh and such a friendly demeanor, that he made

Bob is survived by his sons Bryan and Richard Brandenburg, and his daughter Robin Korte, his stepsons Darold and Steven Brandenburg; his brothers Joe and Marvin, and sister Marie, his nephew Jody Bozarth and his family, as well as his granddaughters Amber, Kasara, Halle, and Azlynn; and his companion Clara Griffin.
