



Robert "Bob" Sehorn

April 26, 1954 - October 2, 2010

Robert "Bob" Sehorn, 56, a 17 year Entiat resident and lifetime Wenatchee area resident, passed away on Saturday, October 2, at Central Washington Hospital.

He was born on April 26, 1954 in Wenatchee, the son of the late Harold and Alyce (White) Sehorn. He was raised and schooled in East Wenatchee and graduated from Eastmont High School in 1972. He worked for Cedergreens and K.B. Alloys briefly before becoming a Heavy Equipment Operator. He became a member of the Laborers' International Union of North America, Local # 292 of Wenatchee. He worked on many area construction projects some of which included Odabashian and George Sellar Bridges, a bridge up the Entiat River Road and the installation of large docks on Lake Chelan. He worked 20 of his years with the Union for the Snitley Company.

While working on one of his construction jobs, he met Cindy Lee (Buck) Robinson. They were later married on January 9, 1993 in Wenatchee. They made their family home in East Wenatchee until moving up the Entiat River Road 17 years ago.

Bob continued his construction jobs until retiring in 2004 with 30 years in the Union. Following his retirement, he began making custom neon light signs at his shop.

He was a longtime member of the Laborers' International Union, local # 292 of Wenatchee, the National Rifle Association, Academy of Model Aeronautics and locally the Red Apple Fliers Club and was a Amateur Radio Operator,

(Ham Radio).

Bob enjoyed shooting guns , flying radio controlled model airplanes, operating his ham radio, riding his Harley Davidson and being at home and in his shop. He found his time being at home to be peaceful and relaxing.

He is survived by his wife, Cindy L. Sehorn, Entiat; one son and daughter-in-law, Jeremy & Alicia Sehorn, Wenatchee; two step-daughters and their husbands, Korina and Carlos Paz, Entiat and Sheena Robinson and Monico Valadez, Chelan Falls, WA; two brothers and sisters-in-law, Doug & Judy Sehorn, Wenatchee and Gary & Devonna Sehorn, East Wenatchee and 9 grandchildren, Ivan, Israel, Monico, Alyce, Natalya, Braedyn, Isaiah, Skylar and Ivy. He was preceded in death by his parents.
