Rose M. Fincher, 80, a longtime East Wenatchee Resident, passed away on Sunday, January 23, 2022, at Central Washington Hospital. She was 80 years old.

Rose was born on July 9, 1941, at Burlington, WA to the late Ross and Ruth (Butterfield) Eaton. Her family moved when she was three to Columbia River Siding, later Rock Island, and settled in East Wenatchee. She attended East Wenatchee schools and graduated from Eastmont High School with the class of 1959.

Rose worked picking fruit prior to meeting Milton Fincher from Alabama. They were married in 1964 and made their home together in Rock Island. Rose went to work as a Housekeeper at Parkside Manor and worked there for over ten years.

In the early 1980's, she worked as the night clerk at the Christopher House.

Later she went to work as a sorter for McDougall & Sons Warehouse. In 2003, Rose retired to be a caregiver for her mother. She has continued to make her home in East Wenatchee.

Rose enjoyed fishing and spending time with her family. She was a volunteer at Serve Wenatchee Valley and the Food Bank.

Rose is survived by her children: James (Joni) Beaty of Albuquerque, NM, Scott (Ana Bolivar-Fincher) Fincher of East Wenatchee, Sherri (Armando) Martinez of East Wenatchee, and Sarah Bustos of Wenatchee; her sisters: Doris (Larry) Chester of Malaga, Dora (Dan) Schmidt of Twin Falls, ID; 18 grandchildren; and 29 great grandchildren. She was preceded in death by her parents and brother: Ed Eaton.
