



Sandra Wyn Gull

November 5, 1958 - June 11, 2012

Sandra Wyn (Moser) Gull, 53, a 25 year Baring, Washington resident and former longtime East Wenatchee resident, passed away at her home on Monday, June 11, 2012, following a sudden illness.

She was born on November 5, 1958 in Wenatchee to Homer Loyd and Geraldine "Geral" (Lewis) Moser. She grew up in East Wenatchee and attended Grant Elementary, Sterling Middle School, Eastmont Jr. High and Eastmont High School. She graduated with the class of 1977. She continued her education at Wenatchee Valley College and also worked at Buttreys Grocery prior to working at Miller's AMC Jeep Dealership in Wenatchee. She later worked at Transamerica Title Company in Wenatchee before moving to Seattle where she worked doing data entry for Dan Humphries and Associates accounting firm.

She had met Steven Arnold Gull "Steve" while on a blind date in Seattle and they were later married on April 19, 1981 in Wenatchee. They made their home in Seattle until moving to Spokane in 1983. Later that year, they moved make their home in Wenatchee. In 1988, they moved to Baring, Washington where they have since continued to make their home.

During the early 1990's, Sandra and Steve owned and operated a firewood business and she worked doing the bundling as well as all of the bookkeeping.

Sandra was an accomplished keyboardist and was a certified 100 word per minute typist and was equally as fast on 10 adding machines.

She grew up in the Wenatchee Church of Christ and later attended the East Wenatchee Church of Christ. She especially enjoyed her family and her beautiful flower gardens, writing and loved to cook for her family.

She is survived by her husband, Steven A. "Steve" Gull, Baring, WA; three children, Steven Benjamin "Ben" Gull, East Wenatchee, Sarah Lindsey (Jim) Gogal, Everett and Sawyer Jeffery (Alexa) Gull, Monroe; her mother, Geraldine "Geral" Moser, East Wenatchee; two brothers and sisters-in-law, Brad & Darnell Moser, Wenatchee and Rod & Connie Moser, Marina del Rey, CA. She was preceded in death by her father, Homer Loyd Moser in 1976.

A Commemoration Service will be held on Saturday, June 23, 2012 at 1:00 p.m. at Heritage Memorial Chapel with Chaplain Scott Langager officiating.
