Scot Frederic Worden of Entiat, WA passed away unexpectedly at his Crum Canyon home on February 22, 2022, leaving a huge hole in the hearts of his close friends and family.

Born September 17, 1958, to Jeremy Frederic Worden and Nancy LeEllen Worden (Jacobsen), Scot graduated from Bothell High School in 1976. He received an Associates in Science from Shoreline Community College, then completed Seattle Central Community College's Dental Laboratory Technician program, on his way to an entrepreneurial career that spanned three decades. Scot began his career with a five-year partnership at the Dunning & Worden dental lab, then opened Seattle Dental Arts, Inc. solo. During his tenure at Seattle Dental Arts, he served as technical advisor on dental cases for the Seattle International Dental Study Club and the Dental Specialists Study Group. After retiring from the dental lab industry, he turned his focus to real estate and investments with his wife, partner, and bride, Teresa.

Scot married the love of his life, Teresa (Huffman), on August 18, 1990. He

affectionately called her his "bride" for 31 years. The two were inseparable, enjoying hunting, fishing, travel, gardening, and entertaining. Anyone who's been to their home knows how much they loved hosting guests and cooking great food. Scot and Teresa built a wonderful life together, creating a dedicated partnership that stood the test of time and served as a shining example that touched many.

Although involved with numerous organizations, Scot preferred to connect with people one-on-one. His zest for living and his wit, wisdom, and hearty laughter created a positive "ripple effect" on so many lives. He was passionate - not only about life but about family relationships - always the first to extend a helping hand. Scot was a fabulous friend, a great neighbor, a devoted husband. On any given day you could always count on his humorous spark and dynamic optimism.

Scot was preceded in death by his father, mother, sister Sandra (Beard), uncle John (Jacobsen), and cousin James (Jacobsen). He is survived by his bride Teresa Worden (Huffman), brother Jay Worden and wife Pamela, and his oldest brother Gilbert Worden. Scot was a proud uncle to nephews Jesse Worden, Tobin, Erik, and Travis (Beard), and quite close with cousins Jill Jacobsen and Jon "Hap" Jacobsen. He was blessed to count many extended family members and friends, including Greg and Teri Beard and father and mother-in-law, John and Sharon Huffman who he whimsically labeled the out-laws.
