Scott Thomas Harmon, 55, a 6 year resident of Wenatchee passed away at his home in Wenatchee on Sunday afternoon July 29, 2012, following a sudden illness.

He was working as a cook at Shari's Restaurant in East Wenatchee. He enjoyed nature and camping in the outdoors and playing in the parks with his grand children, discussing politics, cooking and music.
