



Selmer Lynn Iverson

August 4, 1936 - April 6, 2011

Selmer "Lynn" Iverson, 74, a 6 year East Wenatchee resident and former longtime Bellevue resident, passed away Wednesday, April 6, 2011 at Bonaventure Memory Care in East Wenatchee.

He was born on August 4, 1936 at Santa Barbara, California to the late Selmer and Hannah (Hoxy) Iverson. He was raised in the Long Beach area and graduated from the Santa Monica High School. He took a break and became a ski bum for one year, frequenting Mammoth and Big Bear Mountain ski areas. He continued his education studying Criminology and graduated with his Bachelor's degree from Cal State University. He went to work in Loss Prevention for the Ralph's Grocery Store chain in Los Angeles. He met and was later married to Kay El Wright in Las Vegas, Nevada. They made their first home in La Canada, California. In 1970, he accepted a job with Weisfield Jewelers in their Loss Prevention Program and they moved to make their home in Bellevue. Lynn became a Salesman for Honeywell in 1977 and sold Commercial Fire Evacuation Systems for 25 years before retiring in 2002. They moved to make their home in East Wenatchee in 2004.

He was a member of the WRAC, Wenatchee Racquet and Athletic Club, the TAINTS Bicycle Club and had been on the Alpentel Ski Patrol at the Snoqualamie Summit for over 20 years. He enjoyed bicycling, Tennis, snow skiing and golf. He was especially proud of the hole in one trophy that he earned at the Avalon Golf Course.

Lynn is survived by his wife, Kay El Iverson, East Wenatchee; one son, Jon C.

Iverson, University Place, WA; one daughter & son-in-law, Julie & Bede Sienkiewich, Snohomish, WA and two grandchildren, Curtis and Matthew Sienkiewich. He was preceded in death by his parents.
