Truman "Peet" Peet, 89, a two and a half year Wenatchee resident and former longtime High Desert in Yucca Valley California resident, passed away on Monday, April 12, 2010 at Blossom Valley Assisted Living in Wenatchee. He was born on February 22, 1921 at Buhl, Idaho the son of the late Orville and Carmoleta (White) Peet. He was raised to the age of eight years old at Twin Falls, Idaho prior to the family moving to Wilmington, California. He finished high school in Wilmington and furthered his education at Cal State Long Beach. He graduated with his Bachelor's of Science degree and continued his studies for one more year specializing in Public Health. He began his career as a Jr. High School teacher at Anaheim, California. He later became a Registered Sanitarian, Health Inspector for the San Bernardino County Health Department. He retired in 1976 and continued to make his home in the Yucca Valley until moving to Wenatchee in October of 2007. Peet was a longtime Jazz Band Drummer and played with his group at a variety of gigs, including weddings and the Lighthouse at Long Beach, California. He retired his drumming in 1962.

He especially enjoyed cooking, horticulture and plants, reading, animals and the frustrations of golf.

He is survived by two daughters and son's-in-law, Loree & David Bernett, Wenatchee and Shellee & Louis Valentine, San Pedro, CA; two grandchildren, Jameson Wick, Abilene, TX and Whitney Wick, Wenatchee, WA and two great grandchildren, Devin and Jaylin Hawkins both of Abilene, TX. He was

preceded in death by his parents, one sister, Betty Seehuber and one stepson, John Alexander.
