



## Ward Carlye Garrett

May 10, 1935 - May 11, 2017

Ward Carlye Garrett, born May 10, 1935 to James Eugene and Ella Ethelyn (Jesseph) Garrett in Wenatchee, WA, passed away May 11, 2017. Ward was born and raised in Wenatchee, where he attended Elementary, Junior High and high School, graduating in 1953. He entered the Army in 1954, taking his basic training at Fort Ord, California, and his advanced training as a Mobile Field Lab Technician at Brooks Army Medical Center at San Antonio, Texas. Following his advanced training, Ward was stationed at Madigan Army Hospital at Fort Lewis, Washington. After his service years, Ward attended Wenatchee Valley Jr. College and the University of Washington before going to work for The Boeing Company in 1958. In 1995, Ward retired from his job as Chief Business Systems Analyst for Manufacturing and Tooling Operations, where he was responsible for designing/documenting/certifying and implementing mainframe systems with desk top applications. His last system (On-line Tooling and Information System -OTIS), was still in use some 20 years following his retirement.

Ward is survived by his wife, Karen; two children, Michael David Garrett (wife Tanya) of Bellevue, Washington, and Stacy Dyan Score of Auburn, Washington; three grandchildren, Kendra Conder (husband Seth), Jordyn and Kyle Garrett and step daughter, Suzanne M. Harn. He was preceded in death by his parents James and Ethelyn and his beloved sister, Marilyn.
